Australian Koala Foundation visit

On Tuesday 14th February the Australian Koala Foundation (AKF) conducted an information forum tour visit of our school. Our school leadership group and Ms Withers talked about our koala project and the koala population in the Delungra area.

Visitors came from wide and far to attend the tour, including Sydney and Brisbane. It was very nice of our koalas to put on a display for our visitors, the mother and baby demonstrated all their koala cuteness.

Many of the visitors had never seen a koala in the wild, only koalas in captivity.

This visit was part of a 2-day workshop conducted by the Warialda Shire in conjunction with the Australian Koala Foundation.

The anticipated workshop outcome will be the establishment of a Koala Kiss (this is when remaining habitat areas come close to "kissing" each other in certain areas in the landscape) ranger to be based in Warialda.

There was a night session with a Q&A discussion group based on "A new way of thinking about Koala conservation; independent from government, communities working together to achieve common goals around sustainability and biodiversity and developing Human Plans of Management with a holistic approach to all landscapes."

AKF have chosen the Gwydir Shire as the site of our first Koala Kiss Project because it contains abundant and potentially secure Koala habitat with the ability to have certain points of the landscape connected creating the first Koala Kiss Site.

Effective Learner Award


Jasmine: Excellent effort and stamina in writing.
