Increased influenza infections within the community

According to surveillance data compiled by NSW Health, the incidence of influenza infections among young people under the age of 16 is rising. As a result, there has been an increase in more young children being admitted to hospital with severe illnesses that require immediate care. Currently, the reported cases of influenza in children under the age of 16 account for over 50% of influenza cases.

All students, staff and their families should follow NSW Health's advice to reduce the risk of not only COVID-19 but also other viral illnesses that may affect schools. We ask the following:

- Stay home if unwell or showing even the mildest of symptoms
- Keep up to date with vaccinations - including COVID-19 booster shots and flu vaccines
- Get tested immediately for COVID-19 if you become symptomatic
- Practise good hand hygiene by washing regularly with soap and water.

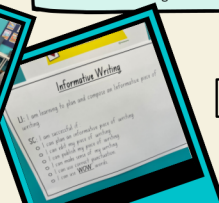
Here's what the class had to say...
