Elephants are herbivores. They eat twigs, leaves, bamboo and roots, foraging for about 16 hours a day.

They can eat up to 150kg of food every day.

Elephants have large bulky bodies and thick grey skin. Their large ears help to regulate their body temperature. They have long trunks to help them with heavy objects and break of limbs from trees or leaves from the top of trees.




School holidays library horrowing

6 Rules when Travelling on a School Bus

What Must I do when travelling on a School Bus.

I must Show the Bus Driver my Bus Pass each time I Travel on the Bus or when
requested and I will have it ready to show the Bus Driver before getting on the
bus.

You <u>MUST</u> be deemed eligible to Travel from Home to School and School to home. If you are not eligible or refuse to apply for free Travel, you must pay a Fare or purchase a Term Pass.



2. I must listen and follow the Bus Drivers directions.

If a student continues to not listen to the Bus Driver and act in a disruptive manner the Bus Driver will put you on report and the event will be investigated by the Manager and may result in the student being refused Travel.

3. I must wear a seatbelt.

Refusal to wear a seat belt may result in the student to be refused Travel. Seatbelts are a legal requirement and must be worn.

4. I must Stay seated.

I must stay seated and wear my seat belt and only get up when I am approaching my stop.

- I must NOT Swear, Yell, Scream or Argue with anyone whilst on the Bus Bad language and Disruptive behaviour will result in the student to be refused Travel.
- I must NOT ever Hit, Push or Spit on anyone on the Bus
 Violence is not tolerated and will result in the student being refused Travel.



REMEMBER: CAVANAGH BUS & COACH BUSES ARE FITTED WITH CCTV CAMERAS, WHEN A COMPLAINT IS MADE BY A DRIVER, PARENT OF A STUDENT OR A MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC, THE FOOTAGE WILL BE REVIEWED TO CONFIRM THE COMPLAINT, AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION WILL BE TAKEN AT THE DISCRETION OF THE MANAGER.

Magpie territory

Magpies nest in this area and may swoop on intruders. This is normal defensive behaviour during the breeding season and lasts up to six weeks.

Protect yourself:

- Move quickly through this area—don't run.
- Wear a hat or carry an umbrella.
- Wear sunglasses for eye protection.
- Bike riders—dismount and walk.
- Don't act aggressively—this will only make things worse—they are only protecting their young.
