Congratulation to all our winners.




Infants' Classroom News

Art- painting and Drawing

This term we have been learning to paint and draw in art. We created a cheetah masterpiece which can be found on the following page.

First, we had to explore the features of the cheetah photo that we were using as stimulus for our artwork. Studying the shapes and colours of the photos. Then we drew the outline in white chalk on our black art paper. After that we learnt about the types of brushstrokes to use to create dimension and shape in our artwork. We used the layering paint technique to make it look like it was coming off the page and it wasn't flat. It took hard work and concentration to get it completed over many weeks. We kept going through the learning dip when experimenting with colour and depth. We have learnt a lot about colour and painting this term.

"I believe that I actually got the colour of the cheetah correct, by using lots of white and yellow in my colour mix" Ella




Throughout the the year the primary class with the assistance of some of the infants students will view and tally the biodiversity capture on these cameras and collect these into reports to be shared with the University of New England.

We look forward to sharing our learning over the year.




Some of the biodiversity captured already.
